GIRTY BURLAL GROUND

The Girty burial ground was established on what was known as the Girty claim in the early days of the Indian territory by Simon Girty, a fullblood Cherokee who was born east of the Mississippi river in 1829 and was brought west in the Cherokee immigration. The Girty claim was located on Big Vian creek about one half mile southwest of Vian, Sequoyah county, in the northeast quarter of section 21.

When the country was sectionized, the north line of section 21 ran directly through the Girty burial ground, and when the county road was later opened up, the tomb stones were removed from the graves, stacked by the side of the road and the road built over the majority of the graves. The inscriptions attached were obtained from the stones where they were piled by the roadside.

Isaac Girty, who was killed in a gun battle in Vian when George Starr, Boots Henson and Bob Landrum were killed in 1892, was the last person buried at this place and has no grave marker.
