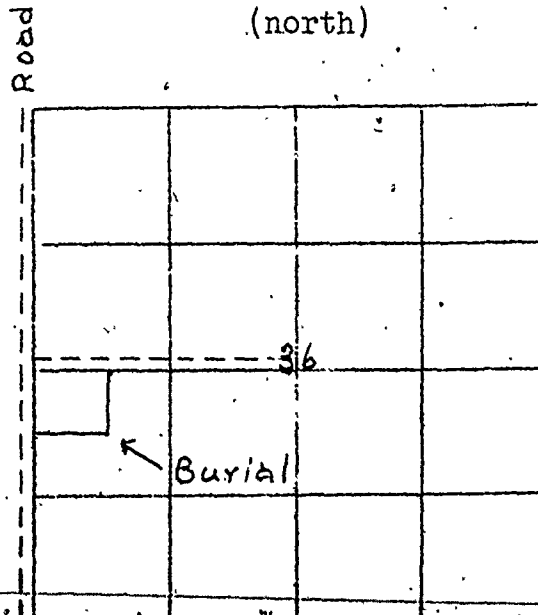

The Folsom Burial is located as follows:-It is in the Northeast quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 20, township 9 North, Range 27 East. This burial ground is in bad shape. It is in a pasture and has no fence around it. I got all of the inscriptions in this burial ground. There were a few unmarked graves in it. About three headstones were standing; the rest had either fallen over or the stock in the pasture had knocked them over. This land belongs to Frank Karl, a Choctaw Indian, who lives North and West of Pocola, a small place consisting of a store and filling station combined.

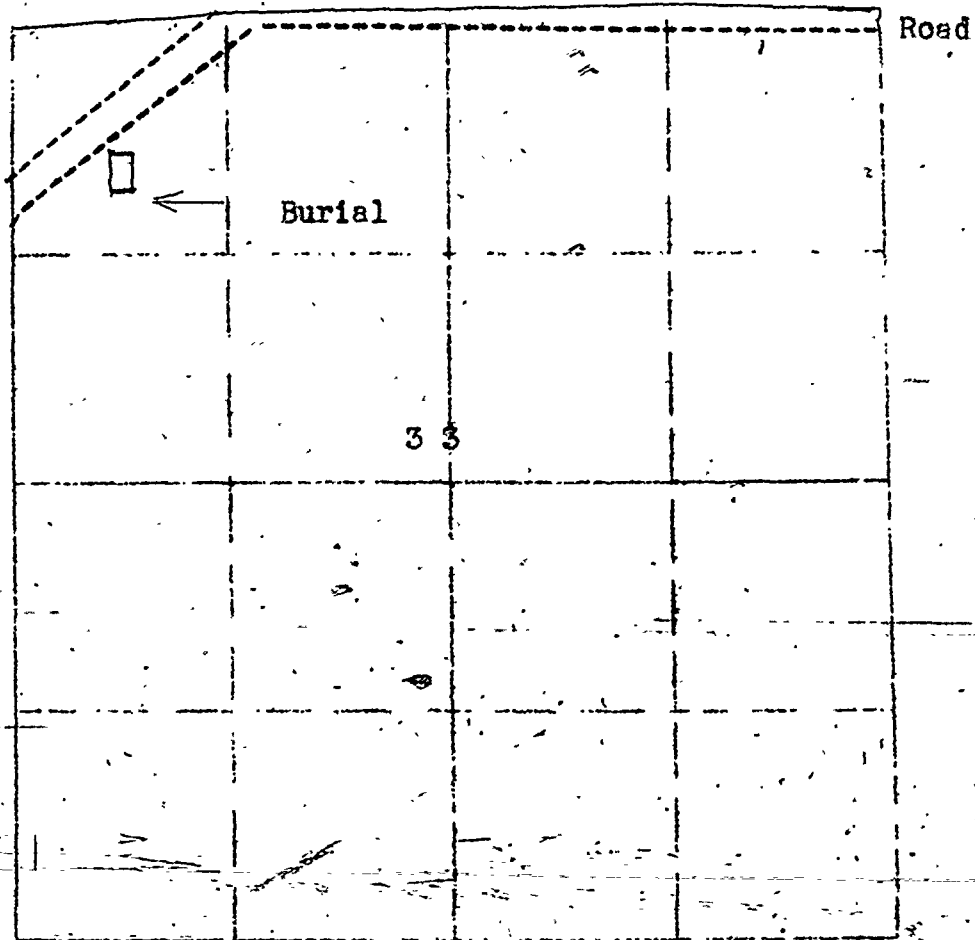

KINKAD INDIAN CEMETERY

A. A. Bysa Kinkade died May 9, 1886, aged 60 yrs.

The above grave has been dug into. It had had a pen of ties built around it but these have been nearly all carried away. The headstone was lying on the ground. Full blood Choctaw.

Lyman Kinkade, died Dec. 4, 1878, aged 50 yrs. This was a full blood Choctaw. The grave had been dug into and the headstone was lying flat on the ground. This is the correct spelling of the name on the headstone. It seems queer that two names pronounced so nearly alike but spelled differently are in the same cemetery.

Rebecka, wife of John LeFlore, died Nov. 26, 1878, aged 20 yrs.

There were several holes dug in this cemetery. These were all the headstones I could find. All graves here were supposed to have been those of Choctaw Indians.

This cemetery is located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$, NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 33 Township 8 North, Range 24 East. The land is part of the allotment of Flaurah B. Ward, wife of Will I. Long, Shady Point.

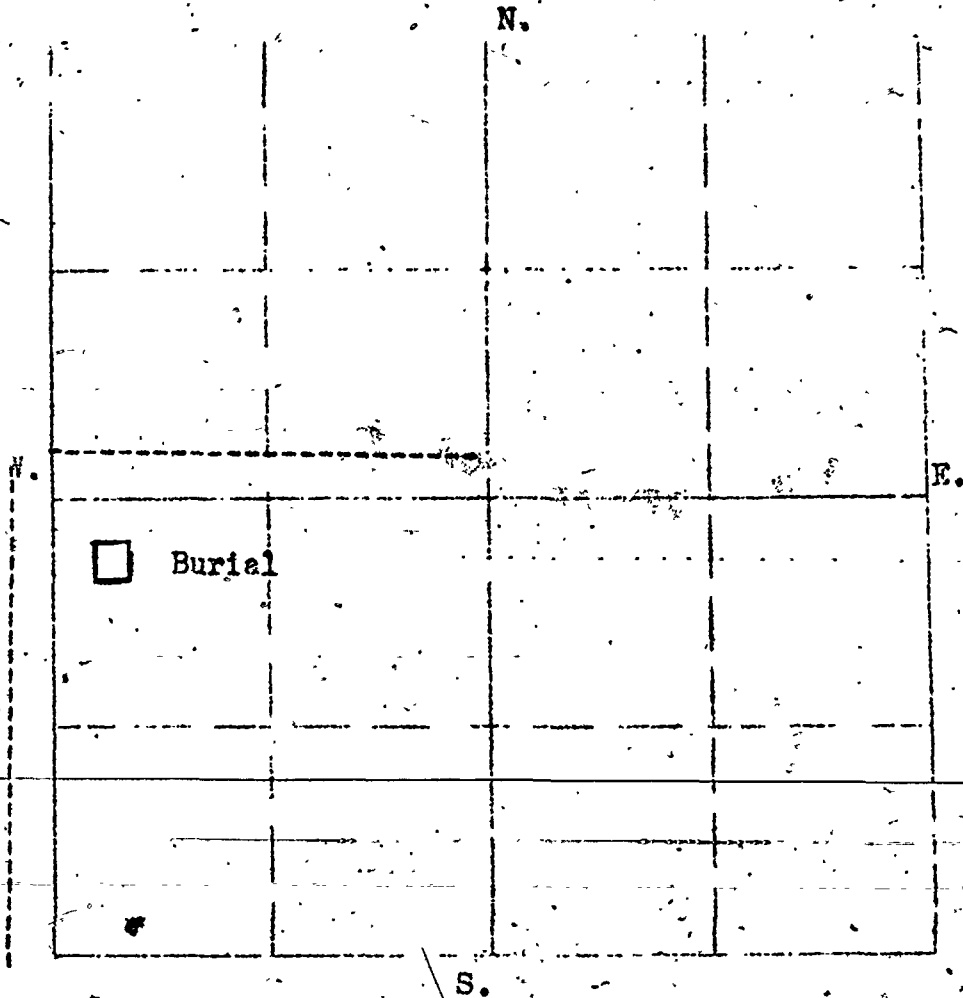

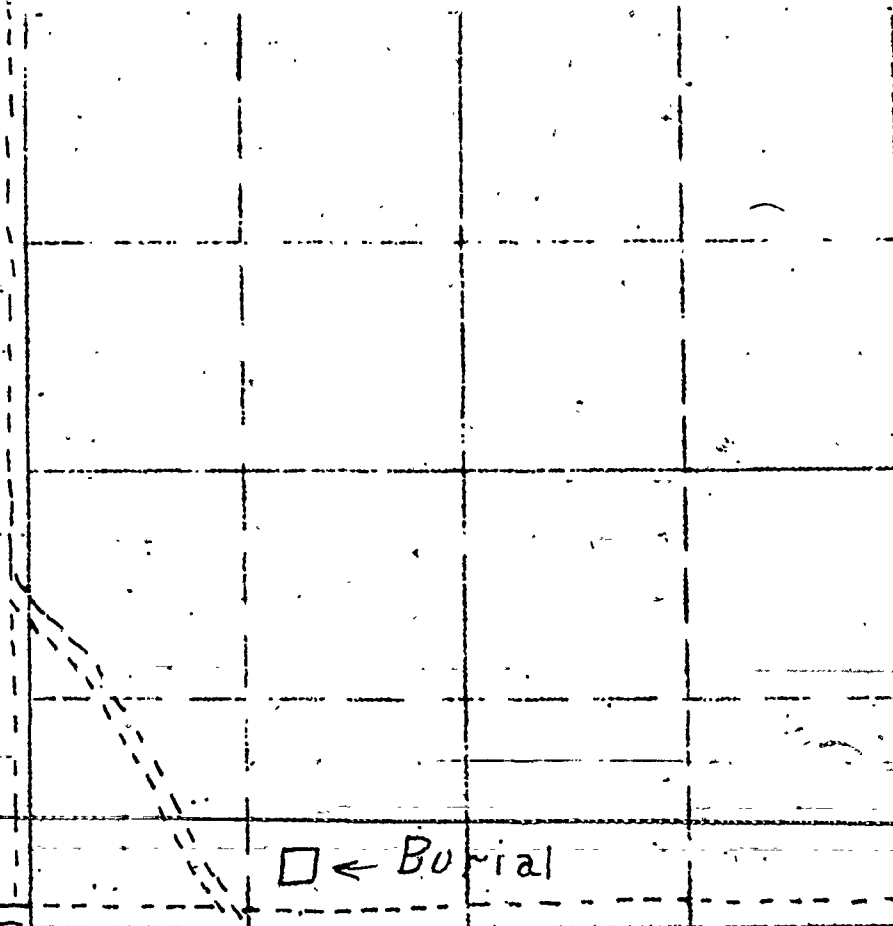

few whites and Indians. It is located in the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$,

Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 27; Township 8 North, Range 24 East.

The land belongs to C. C. Williams of Poteau. It is

located on top of a hill and is very rocky, hence the burials
are not very deep, rocks are put around the graves and filled
in with dirt to put the body deeper. This burial ground is still
in use. There are many graves that just have an unmarked slab of
sandstone at the head and foot of them.

There are two burials here that are side by side, they were
named Tom Blackwaters and James Conkright. Both of these men

Many negroes from Calhoun are buried here.

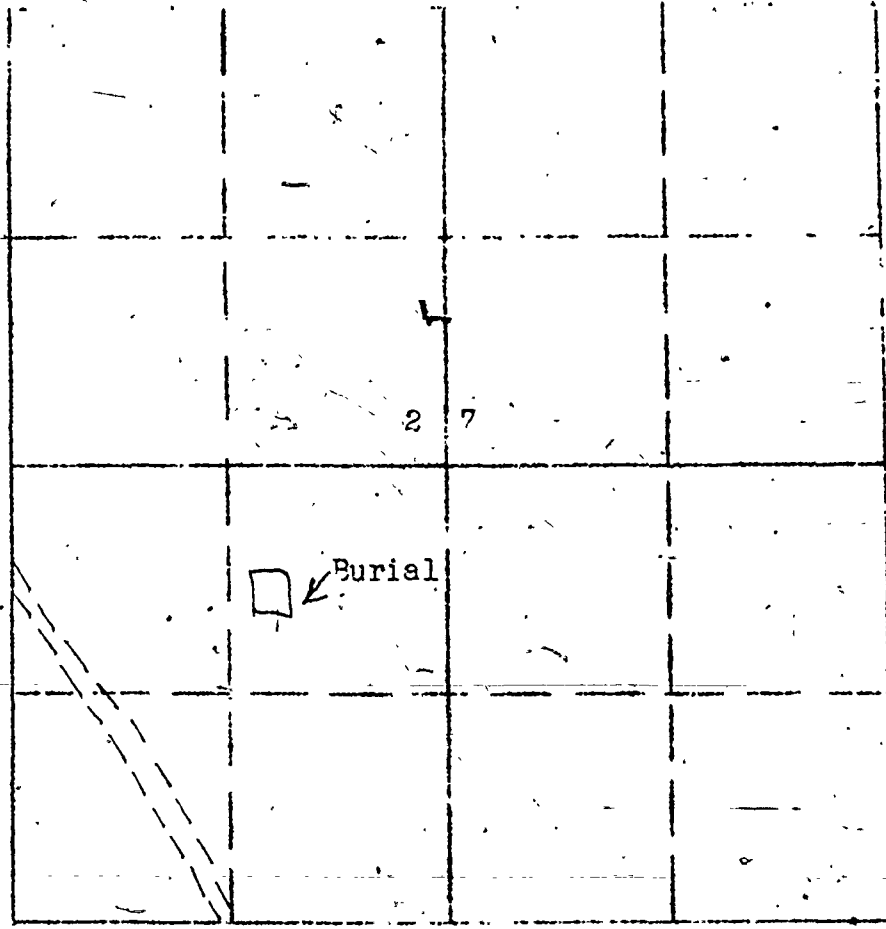

The Shady Grove Cemetery is located in the Northeast $\frac{1}{4}$, Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 27, Range 24 East, Township 8 North. It belongs to the Brazil School District "7. Seldon Taylor, the school teacher at this school, told me that this cemetery started from the first burial of a little negro boy. He did not know when or who he was. This cemetery is right at the edge of the school yard. The children were eating their dinner in the cemetery when I arrived at the school house. There are some very old graves here but have not been able to find out much about them. The graves consist of negro, Indian, and white graves.

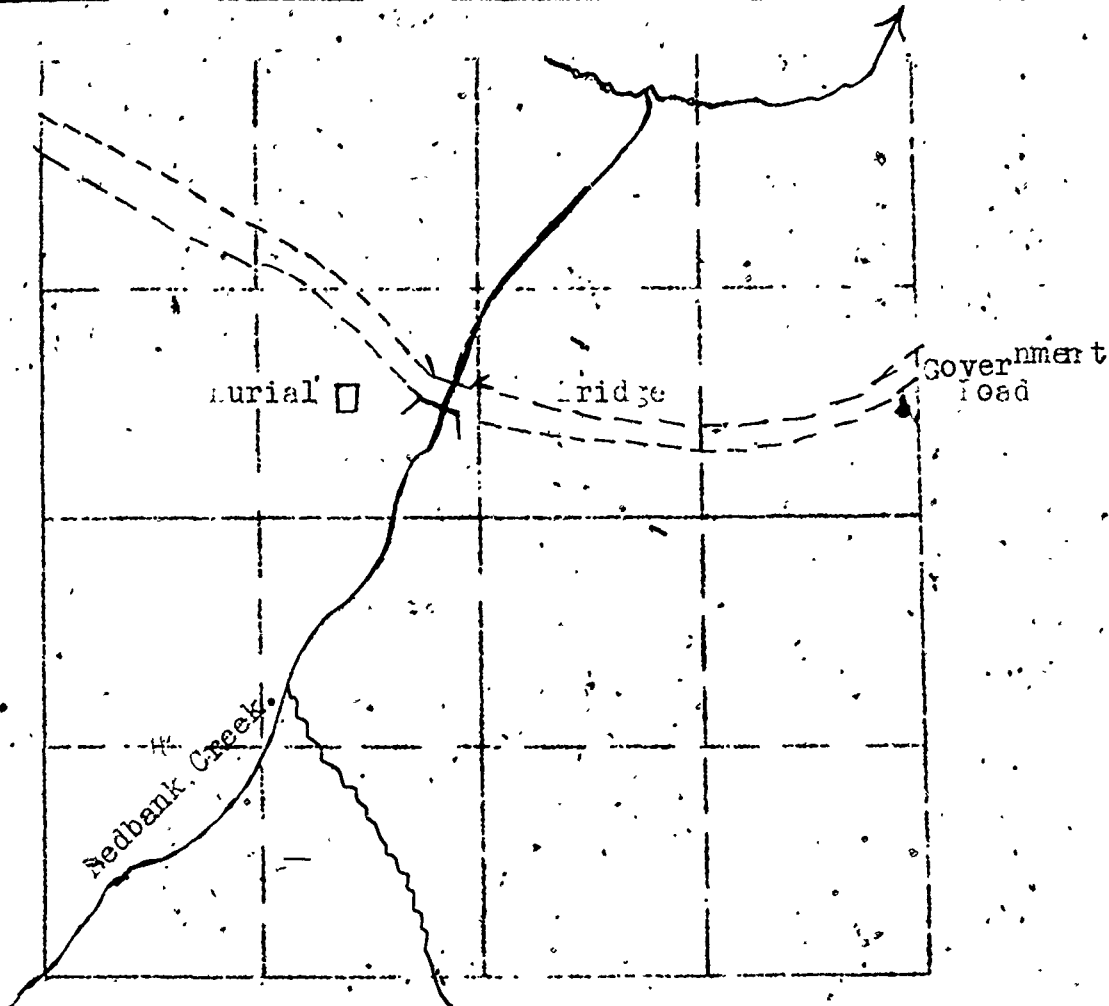

Notes in Detail:

Thomas Burns, died July 4, 1877, aged 52 years.

Thomas Burns was a full blood Choctaw. His headstone has an old cap and ball pistol engraved on it. It has a hand grasping it and the hammer is cocked ready to shoot. Burns was a pretty bad Indian. He lived on a Government road extending from Fort Smith to Stigler. He ran a sort of hotel or stopping place for the travelers on this road. He would hang a sheet up in the corner and place the seat for the guest in front of the sheet, this was when they sat down to the table to eat. He would be hidden behind the sheet and when the guest would put his head close to the sheet he, Burns, would hit him in the head, and then finish him up, take the body out and bury it or throw it in what was called Dead Man's Slough. He did this in order to get what the traveler had, such as his clothes, horses, wagon or whatever he might have.

The wife of Burns was buried by his side but the headstone is one. Both graves have had a rock wall around them but it has been torn down. The grave of Burns looks as though it has been dug into, I suppose some one looking for buried treasure. The old house was supposed to have been haunted by some of the superstitious people; it has been burned.

Many holes have been dug in and around this property by parties looking for buried riches or the loot that Burns

was supposed to have taken from his victims. A man by the name of George Strange, Spiro, Route 1, was digging in front of the hearth of the fireplace of this old house and he dug up some human bones. After investigating the position of the bones he discovered that Burns had dug a hole under the floor in front of the hearth and just jammed the body of this poor victim down in the hole in a sitting up position and covered him up. Burns was shot by a posse near Braden. This grave is located in the Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$, Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$, Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 18, Twp. 9 North, Range 25 East. The land belongs to Cap Hickman, Panama.

In the Northeast $\frac{1}{4}$, Southwest $\frac{1}{4}$, Northwest $\frac{1}{4}$, Sec. 18, Twp. 9 North, Range 25 East, is the site of a bridge that was built by the Government for a road that led from Fort Smith to Stigler. This bridge was built in 1851 across Redbank Creek. This was the stage stop at the house of Thomas Burns. The Pony Express also rode over this bridge. The stones at each end of the bridge are still in place and it looks as though there was no concrete or mortar used in the stonework. This site is called Redbank Crossing. A person can still see evidences of the old trail yet. It was a main traveled road. The timbers were made of hewed tree trunks and according to the reports I have it was a very substantial piece of work.
