Petrified Buffalo head

4 Arrow heads

1 stone ax

1 Cap and Ball revolver

1 bullet mold

2 rattlesnake hides, (one 9 feet, 7 inches long and one 7 feet long)

1 old Bank Check.

Answer to Item 10.

One stone ax found at Okay, Oklahoma.

The face, horns and skull of Water Buffalo petrified into solid rock except the light colored place in forehead. This was found in the North Canadian river bed.

1 Cap and ball revolver was used by the Forty-niners.

1 Bow and 2 arrows that were used by the Cherokee Indians.

1 Bank Check that was written in 1872, to an express company in Buggytown, Indiana.
