

Frank Adams, Bartlesville, Oklahoma. Other information not given.

MR. ADAMS' STORY:

"Location of a few old land marks in and around Bartlesville Ok that seems [sic.] to have been forgotten by many and never heard of by the late arivals [sic.]

"(Blue Mound) 8 miles N. E. Of [sic.] Bartlesville (Bucks Point) 7 miles west on Buck Creek old Road [sic.] to Pawhuska. (Negro Gap.) six miles south on old Road [sic.] to Ocheleta Okla (Twin Mounds) S. E. of Ocheleta (Onion Prairie) [sic.] S. W. on Road [sic.] to Candy Creek. (Choteau Springs), on road to Old Big Heart. now known as Barnsdall OK[ahoma]. (44 Hill) was one of the roads to the south west into the Osage Nation. (Hold Up Hollow) 3 Miles [sic.] west of Bartlesville Okla.

"(Okesa Okla) a small town in the Osage Hills that is known to more Outlaws than any other Town in the state. the People [sic.] in and around Okesa are a friendly lot and good citizens it was not them that drew the outlaws to that location it was the freindly [sic.] hills that gave them shelter from the law."
