MRS. GARVIE'S STORY:

My parents came to Oklahoma from Missouri in  
1904.

My father and his brother-in-law drove thru in a

"My father's brother carried mail from Kiowa Ks.  
to old Ft. Supply before the R. R. was built.

"When we first came to Okla. we lived on a ranch.  
There is supposed to be an old burying ground on this  
place. There were a dozen or so mounds on this place, but  
I have always failed to get anyone interested enough to  
investigate. Also there are some interesting caves near  
us, one especially has interested me, it has bunks built  
on each side with rock filled in with dirt and rooms  
separated with walls built of rock, undoubtedly a hideout  
for some one in the early day. small holes were in the  
walls apparently to shoot thru.

"Another interesting spot near us is a bed of sea  
shells and fossils ~~on~~ I believe one of the highest points  
in Woodward, Co. I am preparing to build a fireplace from

these petrified fish, oysters and other shells found here.
