MRS. KUKUK'S STORY:

My parents came to Oklahoma from Missouri in 1884.

"By train to Atoka My Mother and I Father in Texas
at this time by stage from Atoka to Pauls Valley unloading
400 sheep the night before leaving Atoka men drove
sheep through [sic.] My self & dog was boss"

I have been engaged in "farming sheep raising
run[n]ing boarding houses Myself nursed and sew[ed]
for others receiving no compassion. [sic.] for my work

"I visited Pauls Valley this summer did not find
a living person who lived there at that time

"One church building in Pauls Vall[e]y when we
went there family were Childs, Grant Hill Hopkins
Brown Waite, Langdons McClure first paper published
in our wash house

"I stood on the bank of Canadian river at Murrell
during the run in 89

"Came to what is now know as Chickasha in 1891

"Mr Kukuk made the run in the Cherikoe [sic.]

Strip went to Perry after living in Chickasha 2 year
or about lived in Perry 8 drew a farm in the drawing
at El Reno

"Mr Kukuk past away June 14 1935 is burried in
Chickasha"
