"In the spring of 1896 moved down into what is now Lincoln Jo. at that time it was the Kickapoe Indian reservation Cap Dewees was running the rost office and store for the Indians, their camp had been on the place that my Grandfather leased and he lived in one of their wigwems untill he built his house, that fall my Father and some other mer built a half dugout and got slabs from for N. T. Webb a saw mill man from which seats were made.
