M. MORREY'S STORY:

My parents left the Island in October, 1865, and got to Indian Territory in December of 1865.

They came to Indian Territory in 1865. Both born in Massachusetts ....

"Went to St. Louis, with - - - - - drove. Hard journey Mrs. Mor[r]e's sick, much of the way. Their goods were - - - - - in Red River water and rained.

"Mr. Morrey, was - - - - - by - - - - - Indians who learned to - - - - - after his - - - - - not - - - - - objected to the cruel beating of - - - - - slave. Fortunately he passed away from here on a preaching tour - - - - - he had not even heard of the - - - - - in - - - - - of the slave. He never attacked slavery but not it - - - - - did not approve of it.

"The mission to the Cherokee was closed when the Civil War broke out - - - - - for the Indian of that time were considered Christianize [d] and the American referred called. all of the missionaries home and closed the mission -

"All of these men went home, except one who felt it his duty to stay - I think no harm was gained by his fidelity and his family suffered greatly - If any one could find Annie Wiley or her sister they will be able to give some facts - These two ladies were sisters of Addie Wiley a wonderful girl who was treated at Levi Howard lost her life and was buried in the cemetery near her home."
