SALEM CHURCH, SEVEN MILES SOUTH OF STILWELL, OKLAHOMA

Salem Cherokee Missionary Baptist Church was established about sixty-one years ago, or in 1876. It is on the east side of Little Lees Creek and about seven miles south of Stilwell, Oklahoma. It has always had a large membership of Cherokees, being in a neighborhood of mostly full blood Cherokees.

There has always been several Cherokee ministers in the neighborhood. There are several ministers near to this Church now who hold services there, making it a very noted place for church, Sunday School and singings. Some of the ministers are: John H. Harrison, Rev. Brown, Zeke Acorn, George Liver and Rev. Glory.
