

Mr. N. W. Ramsey of Dibble gave this information about  
the abandoned cemetery at Dibble.

It was in the very early days here in the  
Territory sometime between 1875-1880 that a tract of  
land was laid out by the Government in the Chickasaw  
Nation for a burial ground.

This plat of ground was on or near Dibble  
Creek in what is now Section 33, Township 7 North,  
Range 4 West; this plat was used for some time, then  
a store and post office were established and this  
settlement given the name of Dibble and then a town  
site was laid out and then it was learned that the  
cemetery was in the town site. There were only a  
few people buried in this place and there never  
were any markers put at any of the graves. So  
then it was decided that the cemetery should be  
established at some other place in order that a  
town might be built there, and so a tract of  
ground consisting of ten acres was purchased  
from the Chickasaw tribe in what is now Section

3, Township 7 North, Range 4 West,  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile south, 1 mile east of the old plat and the old cemetery was entirely abandoned in 1895. There is no way of knowing just how many bodies were buried at the old place and people have almost forgotten that this place was ever used as a burial ground.

Mrs. Lollie Moore's home is built on this tract of land and today crops are raised on it.

The new cemetery was established in 1895 with the abandonment of the old one.

The inscriptions attached were taken from graves in the new location in Section 3, Township 7 North, Range 4 West, McClain County.
