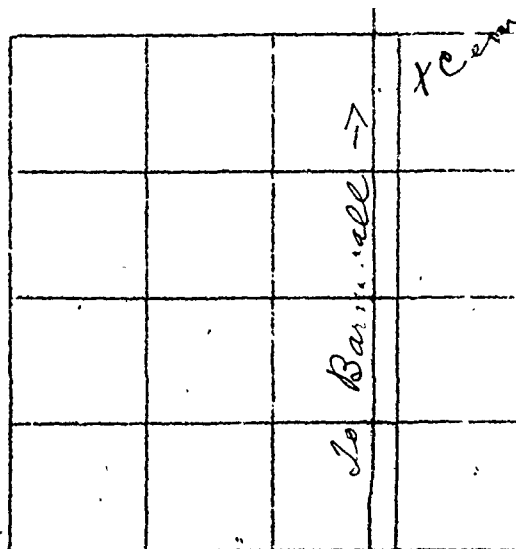

LOCATION OF OLD INDIAN CEMETERY
(Information from Sol Abbot)

Mr. Abbot is 85 years of age. He lives four miles north and about one-fourth mile east of Skiatook. He did not remember the exact date of the founding of the cemetery, but it was started in the late seventies. The Indians, about twenty ~~quapaws~~ were buried in a short period of time, probably 2 or 3 years. It was quite swampy with marshes thereabouts and Mr. Abbot thinks most of them died from malaria.

There is now a truck farm on the premises and no sign whatsoever of a burial ground.
