This Burial Grounds was started in 1868 when the United States Government located and maintained what was called Fort Supply. It was later used for the early day settlers to bury their loved ones.

In 1894 this fort was abandoned and the soldiers were moved to Fort Sill, and the soldiers who had been buried there were moved to Fort Leavenworth Kansas. In 1905 the United States Government granted all of the land including the burial ground to the State of Oklahoma for an Institution for the Insane, which is known as the Western Oklahoma State Hospital.

The Old Fort Supply Burial Grounds is now maintained by the Hospital, and they have a burial ground in connection with it, which joins it on the east. The Hospital has about 355 of their patients buried there. The two burial grounds under one woven wire fence.
