An Interview With Blantha Chase, Alva, Oklahoma.

I was born July 19, 1861, near Chesaning, Michigan.

When I was twelve years old my mother died, after

which time I made my home with my sister near Chesaning,

Michigan.

In May 6, 1879, I was united in marriage to Conrad Schwanz at the Methodist personage in Chesaning, Michigan. We are the parents of ten children.

I had ill health so our family moved from Michigan to Maxwell, Kansas, in 1893. The following year we came to Oklahoma, making our home on a farm twelve miles south of Kiowa, Kansas; we lived there for fourteen years.

On May 6, 1929, we celebrated our golden wedding anniversary. I have ten children, thirty-four grand-children and twelve great-grandchildren who were all at the reunion except one.
