> Interview with Mrs. W. H. Day 928 N. Independence, Enid, Oklahoma.

A lot of people wonder where the Chisholm Trail was located. I can tell you where it went north of Caldwell, Kansas, as it went right through my father's place. It went North and a little East to a town of Austin which is no longer in existence and is shown on few if any maps.

Then it went almost straight north right through my father's farm which was a mile and a half north of Austin and then made a little bend to the right and went through my uncle's farm. I think it was in Township 36.

Run. For sometime we lived out by Lahoma in the early days.
