EUCHEE-CREEK INDIAN BANDS.

In the early days of the Muskogee-Creek Nation, the Uchee (Eucheas) band of Creeks were scattered in various settlements or bands. The Big Pond Band lived along Salt Creek in the present southwest corner of Creek County. They were the salt makers. They lived partly by the chase of the buffalo, deer, turkey and wild hogs of the bottom lands.

The Tiger Bone (Cacha-junne) Band lived upon the border of the Creeks County and had a buffalo camp near the crossing of Uchee-Creek with the highway between Drumright and Cushing. They had frequent clashes with the wild men of the Plains. They had some domestic buffalo.
