Her, Ellis Mackey, grandfather was the Medicine man of her tribe, Chectaw Indians. He was total blind, her uncle then a small boy led him around and helped gather the roots and herbs to make medicine. He died in 1880 and was buried beside herefather in the front yard of their home. She remembers their ball game. They wore only a cloth for a girdle and they would play ball all day and cance all night. They would paint a cross on their chest and forehead, when death occurred in their tribe, they would be buried and later a day set, known as cry day. She came to Garvin county in 1908.
