Gomer Gower Interviewer August 24, 1937

The cemetery reported herewith is of interest perhaps only to Indians of the early period in the history, of the Indian Territory. .

Only three of the headstones can be found and they lie as mute evidence of vandalism in its most vicious form.

A legend is that the wife of Lyman Kingkaid was possessed of a large sum of money which she kept sewed up in her clothing. Several years after her death, one Douge Le Flore surreptitiously opened her grave and found the money. Upon this being discovered others started opening graves with the regult that even today when walking through the old burying ground one

has to be careful lest he fall into an opened grave.

It is located in a forest of large trees near the edge of an old field. A very large dead cak tree now lies prone across what once were graves.
