A CHERK INDIAN BURIAL.

Peter MeNac was a full-blood Creek Indian living about 14 miles south west of oten in the Deep Fork bottom, and was one of many other Indians who held interests arge pestures which were leased to Texas cattleman. In 1902 the smallpox broke in this vicinity and the moNac family were all down with it at once. Mossie c, the youngest son, died and after his body was lowered in the grave they placed new saddle, blanket bridle, boots and spurs on the casket and covered with dirt.

mext porning has brother George went to the grave which he found open and the madend, other articles were gone. George stood there and finally said, "well, white nob it Indian alive, and rob it deed."
