The White Oak Cemetery was established by fullblood Indians of the Cherokee tribe, about 1871, according to Hiram A. Williams, whose Cherokee family took their allotment adjoining the cemetery.

The first grave was that of a fullblood Cherokee named Doublehead, who was a soldier in the Civil War, evidently a Northern soldier, as he is not listed in Stand Waitie's regiment.

his grave was marked by a sandstone monument with only his name on it, and in 1871 his body was taken up and removed to a private cemetery, known as the Doublehead Cemetery, only a quarter of a mile north of the White Oak Cemetery, where, according to Mr. Williams, a monument was erected at his grave.

After Doubleheads removal from his original burying place, the Indians then living in that vicinity began using this place as a public burial ground, and it is now used by the town of White Oak as well as by the country round-about, although it is a two and a half-mile drive from White Oak and difficult of access.

It is located in the White Oak hills, in what was once a thickly settled Cherokee settlement. The Cherokee tribe is now scattered and only a few Cherokees are living

in that vicinity.

H. A. Williams first settled on his wife's allotment adjoining this cemetery in 1907, and is still living at the same place, his address being Vinita, R.F.D. 4.
