a sheriff in the early days who was murdered by Johnson Corn-

tassel at the old Going Snake Court House on Peacheater Creek, about four miles west of the present town of Westville, Oklahoma.

The Motons are also buried in this cemetery. When the allotment law was passed the Cherokees asked for this acre to be set aside for a cemetery, it was granted. It is now used by many families including both whites and Cherokees.
