EDITORIAL ON ISPARHECHER

The greatest of the Creek chiefs and the last of the fullblood governors--the hero and idol of the Creek fullbloods--the most sagacious and far-seeing Indian of modern times. It was through the influence of Isparhecher that the treaty under which the Creek lands are now being conveyed in severalty was made possible. Always progressive, he was the friend of the white man. Of his own motion he dissolved the Creek courts, which had become corrupt, and advised the Indian to turn the matter of law-making and of government over to his white brother, assuring them that it was the will of the Great Spirit.
