CHIEF ROLLY MCINTOSH

"Among his personal friends (i.e., the friends of Father Murrow) was Chief Rolly McIntosh, a leader of the Southern Creeks, and a brother of General William McIntosh, who was killed by the Creeks in Georgia because he favored the removal treaties. It is for this family that McIntosh county is named. Mr. Murrow tells of hearing Rolly McIntosh make an address at North Fork Town in which the Chief characterized the various Indian tribes. The Choctaws and Chickasaws, he said, were the most reliable; the Cherokees the best soldiers; the Creeks and Seminoles the most industrious."
