EDITORIAL ON ROLEY McINTOSH

Hon. Roley McIntosh was in town Tuesday morning on his way home from Muskogee, where he had been for a consultation with Chief Porter. When interviewed by Enquirer's representatives for information concerning the issuance of deeds he stated that the Chief had assured him that it would be but a short time -- probably not more than two or three weeks -- until the deeds would be signed and the delivery would be begun. Col. McIntosh in no way blames Chief Porter for the seemingly unnecessary delay, and is sure that the deeds will be forthcoming in a very short time.

Capt. W. E. Gentry also consulted Chief Porter this week anent the matter of deeds and thinks some what differently from Col. McIntosh.

He expects the chief to wait until the supplemental treaty has been disposed of, when a special session of the council will be called and then action

taken.
