Dear Sir:-

It affords me a source of boundless pleasure to answer your most welcome and highly appreciated letter that I received some weeks ago. I am sorry to say that I could not ans sooner on account of sickness which confined me in bed for several weeks.

I have no Indian relics of any kind, but will send you the best modern collection I can get. There is only one genuine relic I know of in this country and it is a tomahawk used in the famous battle of Tohopeka or Horseshoe Bend on the Tallapoosa River Alabama in 1813, it is in splendid state of preservation and used daily by an old Indian Chief as a pipe of peace. I have often heard him say, "Only a

dollar and I'd be a millionaire for every wound this hatchet has inflicted in mortal flesh."

If I ever can manage to secure this valuable relic I will do so with pleasure.

I extend to you many thanks and countless gratitudes for your compliment.
