Dear Bob.

The labours of the convention were ended last evening having been in session three weeks; and I am right glad that the work is gone through with; it is to be submitted on the first Wednesday in April to the people, for their approval or rejection. There is to be a Principal Chief with three inferior Chiefs; Judiciary have undergone considerable change; Judges of the Supreme Court as well as circuits are to be by appointment; do away Justices and Constables, substituting County Judges, similar to our old Constitution in that respect being elective; A Sheriff with a competent number of light horsemen elected in each County the latter appointed by the District Chiefs and subject to their orders. The seat of Government has been permanently loca-

ted at the town of Doaksville -

This is about all, of the most important features, of the Doaksville Constitution I am glad to say to the credit of those who participated in ^{that they} the framing of the new Constitution, were with few exceptions harmonious; having the good of the people as the primary object in all their deliberations - There was a paper handed in to the Committee drafting the Constitution supposing to be from you or Cochran and the clause inserted although provisions to the same effect had been made.
