It is understood, the Northern Ojibwa, Michitas and other Bands who have been acting with the South in the present war have also come down in at Cherokee Village and propose to join the Indian League. The unity of the Indian race will enable all to secure their rights, perpetuate their race and assume a position of strength and respectability among the Nations of the Earth. The Delegates including Gen. Armstrong of Texas will attend the Grand Council at Armstrong Academy on the 10<sup>th</sup> inst. Allow me to say it is of the greatest importance that you and the Choctaw Delegates be present.
