

Imagery stipulation made and entered into  
this 19<sup>th</sup> day of June 1865, at Portville -  
Sherman Nation, between Sergt. Deane  
A. H. Matthews and Mrs. Nancy. Ad. O. S.  
Commissioners appointed by the Michigan  
Auditors of the United States, and P. P.  
Pettyjohn, Governor and Comptrol Chief  
of the Cherokee Nation, on the part of said  
Nation as follows to wit:-

Article II

All acts of hostilities on the part of both  
armies having ceased / by order of  
a Commission entered into on the 26<sup>th</sup> day  
of May 1865 between Major Genl. E. R. S.  
Canby, M. A. Comd'g Military Division  
West. M. P. and Genl. Shilby Smith Ad. a.  
Comd'g same M. P. Department, the Ordians  
of the Cherokee Nation her self represented -  
plainly allied with the English or other States  
in acts of hostilities against the Government  
of the United States, do agree at once  
to return to their respective Arms and

There remain at least out the United States, and often no indignity whatever, or Commit- any act of hostility against the whole, or portions of the various States who have been friendly to or engaged in the service of the United States during the war.

### Article and

It is stipulated by the undersigned Com- missioners on the part of the United States, that so long as the conditions aforesaid remain the provisions of article first of this Agreement, they shall be protected by the United States authorities, in their person and property; not only from encroachments on the part of the United States, but also from the obnoxious acts of persons engaged in the service of the United States,

### Article and

The above article of agreement to remain and be in full force, and effect until the meeting of the

Grand Council to meet at Armstrong  
Academy Choctaw Nation, on the  
first day of September 1865, and  
until such time as the proceedings  
of said Grand Council, shall be  
ratified by the proper authorities, both  
of the Choctaw Nation and the United  
States.

P. R. Pritchlynn Governor and Principal Chief  
of the Choctaw Nation, have hereunto set  
their hands and seals.
