Paris (Kentucky)

October 14th, 1824.

My dear Sir:

Your father wrote to you from Georgetown. We took the stage at that place this morning, and arrived here this evening. In about ten days from this time, we shall be at Washington City.

Nothing has occurred on our journey worth relating. I presume you have heard the particulars of what occurred the first day of our departure. I am not a saint, but I am generally sensible when I commit improprieties. I have gone through a course of repentance, and sinned again. I took a wine frolic a few evenings ago, with some young men of Georgetown, and am now suffering from the effects of it. — I shall write to you again upon my arrival at Washington City.

Your father requested me to mention to you that he forgot some valuable papers at home. 1st. A power of Attorney from our Keneday 2nd. A certificate from ~~our~~ Major Blue. 3rd. A letter of recommendation from Geo: S. Gaines to John C. Calhoun. — Enclose these papers, immediately, to J. C. Calhoun at Washington City, and request him to deliver them to your father.
