St. Louis, Nov. 28th 1832.

Rev. Mr. Henderson,

Dr Sir

With this, you will receive two Omaha boys, sent by that nation to your school, under the provisions of their Treaty of 1830. Those boys are the grandson & nephew of the principal chief called the Big Elk. Their names are Sans souci, or without care, (called Lewis,) is the grandson and She-non-bah, (Two wings - called Pack) the nephew. They are about 12 years old.

They are furnished with a cloak, pantaloons, jackets and two calico shirts, two pair socks each, & a cap & shoes and handkerchief & mittens.


Those boys are in charge of Augustus Rev. Esq. to Louisville, from that place
