My Dear Son

We are all alive as yet
But I cannot say we are all well
your mother has been on well for
some time and dos not git no better
it is a rising in thy Brist and it bracks
and she discharges it out of her mouth
some thing like a Bill had brock when
it bracks she gits batter untill it rises
again -- I have not been well my
self but I am old and it is time for me
to bee off I shall some be 71 years old
your Sisters are all ^{were} and going to school
and my grand children are all well
the longer I stay the worse
I disspise white people for see that none
but a few is friends to the Red man there
for I wish my children was with these
own Nation befor & die --
I am sorry to find there will ^{be} as oppres-
sion in the family as there is part that
do not wish and live with there own
Nation - How eland family wants
to go to Jack cash and Samuel and
family wishes to stay in this Country
and Thomas says he will go and see
you next fall and if he lick it
he will go to where you are I am
march to libble to find ⁱⁿ my old Days

that I must be separated my children
and no hopes a man to see them any more
in this world O my Dear Son You
cant think how I am hurt I wrote wild
water yes again sorry I am oblig to stop
writing -

O the whit people are no
friends to Indians Therefor I have but few
among the whits I must say Doctor Wain
is the last that I have = my stock of
Horses and Cattle are now all Stol &
gotten ⁱⁿ Sants and have no justes do
me the steal my Property and I am
throd in the Cost and I am giting to be
a poormen - a few old friend Doctor
McGinty is Dead he was murdered
by Chacklaw and he is running to your
country - - - your mother son,
her love to you and family and also to
her Sisters and there family pray
as I do she is grieved past from her
children in old age - I hope god
will Bless you and yours -

If I live I will write you a letter next May I
expect to be at the Chickasaw Land office to try
to buy a few carons land - The Chickasaws have
sold there country and when they go they will
go as poor as if they had never had any
country. They will be among as poor
D's - ~~The~~ They have treated Chacklaw mean
by giving them no land - James Cotter is
all the friend the Chacklaws had in the
Nation Dear Peter I hope god
will be with you and your family
