My Dear.

This ^{will} be mailed tomorrow. I am
told Old H. Scammon of Eagle County
came here yesterday and tells me among
other things that he was at Howell's last
Saturday and there learned that Kennedy
was very low, that he could not last
but a few ^{days} more. Matilda has gone
down for the children. Alfred Wade
came in yesterday evening. Robt. Vail
day. I mention these names merely to let
you know that I am in much agreeable
company. Old Cole is the only open Eastern
Speaker here, and is impeached for high crimes
and misdemeanors. The House passed Resolutions
of impeachment this morning with six
charges against him - the vote stood 12
and 4. The Senate is to try him. The Star binder
for of this week will contain the Impeachment
Resolution which you must read when it
reaches you. Several things have transpired
here within the present week - which I will

not now mention - but they all work for the
good of the old delegation. Cole it is believed
will be turned out. I have a big majority in
both Houses - I can't tell when I shall leave
for Washington will not stay longer than
necessary. Isaac is well and in good spirits.
We don't intend to leave till we make a
full finish of what we want. This we will
be able to ~~do~~ do with little trouble if Cole is
turned out office. No body has been heard
to say ought against ^{one} here - not from no
part of the nation that I hear from. Old
Cole seems to be only open every chance
