

Quarterly Report Shewing the con-
dition of the Choctaw Academy
on the 31st January 1830

In this report it only becomes
necessary to refer to those ending on
the 31st July and 31 Oct 1829, as no
material change has taken place
since that time except the send-
ing home a few both of the Creek
and Choctaw's last fall, and the
rest of seven Choctaw youths, ~~all~~
of which was at the proper time
announced to the Dept.

The Students are now all
in good health: not one on the
sick list. Every necessary provision
for board and clothing, lodging &c
has been amply made for the
winter and spring.

~~It becomes~~ It is a circumstance
worthy of notice that all Vestus

remark it as a matter of aston-
-ishment to see so many youths
together all exhibiting so fine and
healthy appearance, and indeed to
us who have the special charge of
those youths it is a matter of the
most gratifying character to find
the ~~students~~ ^{them} bless'd with such uniform
good health.

There are fifty Six Choctaws ~~and~~
twenty-five Creek and ten Pictawat-
-amies making a total of ninety
one Indian youths now in school.

The rules and discipline of the
Institution have been with due
caution in kindness faithfully &
and regularly enforced.

During the last quarter the students
have behaved and progress'd well; they
have given little or no trouble in
the gov't of the school, consequently
the Institution sustains the same
respectable character that it has done
heretofore. Virtue, Morality ~~and~~

and the principles of the Christian
religion, as well as those of civilized
life, are regularly taught & impress^d.
on the minds of students, together
with the usual ~~course~~ course of
education.
