

A Report showing the condition of the Choctaw Academy in Scott
County Kentucky on the 1st May 1835

We have at this time in the institution one hundred
and twenty Indian youths.

In this this report we are not able to state as in most
other cases that we have ^{had} none on the sick list, but from
our number and the sickness with which our country
has been afflicted they have been comparatively few.

As to the general state of health at this time
I refer you to the report of Dr. John Cotton the attending
Physician — The school, as to the state of advancement in
the various literary branches, and the improvements in
the mechanical department is in as flourishing and
prosperous condition as at any former period.

The ~~same~~ apertant mentioned in our last report
yet continue and if possible have increased in persever-
ance and industry in the discharge of their respective
duties in filling their several stations.

The Gen^l. concerns of the school as regards boarding
clothing medical attention &c are abundantly sufficient
and satisfactory.

The uniform regulations of discipline & government
of the school noticed in our former reports are still observed

and regularly enforced

The Students have just rec'd their Spring & Summer clothing which are decent neat and comfortable.
