in Scott County Kentucky on the 1<sup>st</sup> Nov 1835.

We have in the institution at this time as follows  
And sixty three Indian Students

Making a total of 163 Students As above  
all in good health and fine Condition with a very  
few exceptions as to the health of the students for the last  
quarter reference is given more particularly to the  
Report of Dr. Branham herewith.

The general concerns of the teaching department  
are in good Condition under the most approved regulations  
as to government and discipline. Religious exercise are  
regularly attended to twice a day, on each Sabbath  
agreeable to an order of the Gov<sup>mt</sup> in specification.

The boarding clothing medical attention and every  
necessary provision is amply and abundant.

The progress in point of improvement in learning is fully  
equal to any period of the school. The Teachers are competent  
Attentive and Industrious

The students appear as happy and ~~and~~ as well contented  
or indeed more so than any former period

The Winter Clothing has just been Rec<sup>d</sup> all of good  
and comfortable quality; in a word, the school is in fully  
as good or better condition than common - all of which  
is respectfully submitted
