First We entered Mr J L Gardney room - who had 28 Students all in good order and none missing We heard them Examined on Geography and English Grammar and in our opinion they performed well ~~we~~ ^{we} saw Shows a specimen of their hand writing and it appeared to us a good plain business hand and the Young men were all clean and well clothed

Next To the room occupied by Mr Rood who had 34 Schollars James Winchell was at the Sulphur well - J Sarsell sick and J Berryhill in the store - - The ballines in good order and performed well in reading

The next and last room was ~~supersurme~~ overlooked by a Young Indian by the name of Cornelius Fulsom with 41 Schollars and on calling the Roll there were 4 missing (J B Wt) James Jackson at the well R M Johnson at the well C B Bushhead at the well and John Goetha an business Most part of this last room was composed of Small boys and in our opinion they were in as nice and good order as any school of its size in the Country

We then Examined their quarters or lodging ~~room~~ rooms 10 in No under their different Monitors which were all in good clean order well adapted to the season - - There were some little lack of Towels and other Contingencies ^{for washing} which were all furnished forthwith by Doct Robt Evans and a plenty of all such articles to be furnished on application

We then waited on their dining room - after the first bell rang the plates were all furnished by the different Monitors - and on the 2^d ring they all went in like bees to the hive Sat down and partook of an Elligant Dinner in good order (no pulling and halting) if any thing was lacking it was handed by the Monitors
