Choctaw Agency. March 1st 1854

Col. P. P. Pitchlynn Sir

- I suppose you would like to

hear from our Nation. I have a letter from Daniel Folsom to the Chap. Gov. McClinton, giving a sketch of the movements, of the voice of Convention or no Convention and was satisfied there will be no Convention. Peter Folsom has said you told him he will run for the District Chiefs office. There is no opponent out as yet. There is one poor Choctaw young man now in jail who is sentence to be shot yesterday the 4th inst. Capt Whiskey, is the master of it. Davis Jones makes a good Circuit Judge of that. He will generally please all who has business under his notice; I wish when convenient write & let me hear how you all get along in your various business.

Well as some of us have been informed that some of the northern tribes are anxious to join the Choctaws on terms like unto the Chickasaws with us, I have communicated the matter to some few of our sober minded men of this District and I find no objection, as to receiving the tribes - I suppose you to have some knowledge of the wishes of those tribes referred to -

I have nothing that I can communicate
to you. You must close by wishing
your success of your important business
which is laid upon your shoulders
