INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF THIS ESTIMATE

- 1. Estimate, as far as practicable, for all the goods that will be needed for one year.
- 2. SEPARATE ESTIMATES MUST BE MADE FOR SCHOOLS AND FOR EACH TRIBE HAVING SEPARATE FUNDS.
- 3. Estimates must be submitted in duplicate. The two copies should be CAREFULLY COMPARED and made to agree in every particular. Mark one "Original," and the other "Duplicate."
- 4. Insert in the proper columns the information called for. The quantity, if any, purchased in open market as well as that furnished or to be furnished under contract, and by Indians, should be included, as it is essential to know all that has been allowed.
- 5. The quantity of each article on hand June 30, 1913, must be stated. Where a large quantity of an article is on hand, and an additional quantity is asked for, the condition of the quantity on hand, or the purposes for which intended, whether for issue or other purposes, should be stated in the column for "Remarks and justification," otherwise the quantity asked for is liable to be disallowed.
- 6. Compute the "Estimated total cost" of each article at the printed price and enter in the proper column. The "Estimated total cost" columns must be added, carried forward, and the aggregate given at the end. Total of each class must also be shown.
- 7. Specify clearly under "Remarks and justification" THOSE ARTICLES WHICH CAN BE PURCHASED OF INDIANS, otherwise the article or articles will be purchased under contract.
- 8. Opposite certain articles, sizes or descriptions have been printed in the column for "Sizes." Over these should be placed the quantities of each required. To avoid the purchase of articles of sizes that can not be used, particular care must be taken to give the sizes desired. As to clothing, be guided by the "Standard of sizes" on page 8.
- 9. This estimate blank has been prepared with great care and with reference to the requirements of the several sections of the country. With the exercise of a little care and judgment superintendents should be able to make a selection suited to the local conditions. It is not intended that any superintendent shall estimate for *every* article on the blank, but only for such things as are suitable and *actually necessary* for the conduct of his agency or school.
- 10. Estimates must be confined to the articles on this list as far as practicable; but if articles that are actually necessary can not be found therein, they may be asked for on the blank pages provided for the purpose at end of the blank, but the reasons therefor must be given. Positively no item interlined will be considered.
- 11. Estimates for permanent improvements, such as buildings, etc., should not be made on this blank, but should be made the subject of special estimates.
- 12. Repairs for mowers, reapers, etc., also must be estimated for separately, and accompanied by a special report as to the number, kind, and condition of articles needing repairs, whether these are the property of Indians or not, and the care taken of them by Indians.
- 13. If any articles printed in this estimate are needed prior to July 1, 1914, call for them on Form 5-262, attaching complete justification, and DO NOT LIST THEM HEREIN.
 - 14. The time fixed for sending in the estimates is very important.
 - 15. Particular attention must be given to the shipping directions called for.
- 16. IF, IN THE OPINION OF SUPERINTENDENTS, GASOLINE, KEROSENE OIL, OR ANY OTHER ARTICLE EMBODIED IN THIS ESTIMATE, CAN BE PURCHASED BY THEM IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO THEIR SCHOOL OR AGENCY TO BETTER ADVANTAGE TO THE GOVERNMENT THAN UNDER CONTRACTS TO BE MADE BY THIS OFFICE, THE LOCAL PRICE SHOULD BE CLEARLY STATED IN THE COLUMN "REMARKS AND JUSTIFICATION."
 - 17. FIRST FULLY AND SPECIFICALLY JUSTIFY REQUEST FOR ANY ITEM UNUSUAL IN CHARACTER OR QUANTITY THAT MAY BE ASKED FOR.
- 18. THE SHOULD YOU CONTEMPLATE THE SALE TO EMPLOYEES OF ANY OF THE SUPPLIES ESTIMATED FOR HEREIN, SPECIFY QUANTITY IN "REMARKS AND JUSTIFICATION" COLUMN, OPPOSITE THE RESPECTIVE ITEMS. AND GIVE REASON.
 - 19. SPECIFY IN "REMARKS AND JUSTIFICATION" COLUMN WHICH ITEMS AND WHAT QUANTITIES ARE TO BE ISSUED TO INDIANS.
 - 20. SPECIFY IN "REMARKS AND JUSTIFICATION" COLUMN WHICH ITEMS ARE REQUESTED FOR NOONDAY LUNCHES AT DAY SCHOOLS.
- 21. SPECIFY IN "REMARKS AND JUSTIFICATION" COLUMN WHEN SUPPLIES ARE ESTIMATED FOR INDIAN POLICE AND FOR FIELD MATRONS, GIVING THE NUMBER OF POLICEMEN AND FIELD MATRONS.

ALLOWANCES.

The following tables show the maximum allowance of certain articles for each pupil. Agents and superintendents will be governed by them in making their estimates. When absolutely necessary to increase the allowance of any article, the officer making the estimate must give good reasons therefor in the column for "Remarks and justification."

Allowance for each Bed.

4 sheets, unbleached—for one year.

3 pillowcases.

2 woolen blankets.

2 cotton blankets.

1 counterpane, white.

The blankets and counterpane ought to last several years.

Allowance for each Boy.

1 uniform coat.

1 pair of uniform trousers.

1 corduroy coat.

2 or 3 pairs of corduroy trousers.

4 pairs of overalls.

3 jumpers (for boys in shops). 3 suits of summer underwear.

3 suits of winter underwear.

4 pairs canvas gloves.

2 collars, white rubber or celluloid.

2 nightshirts.

1 cap, corduroy. 1 cap, military.

1 hat, military. 7 pairs of hose.

6 shirts.

1 duck reefer (for teamsters and farm boys).

Necessary buttons, etc.

3 pairs of suspenders.

4 pairs of shoes.

Allowance for each Girl.

1 winter uniform of blue or gray cloth (should last two years; $4\frac{1}{2}$ yds. to each dress). 1 summer uniform of cotton goods (8 yds. to each dress).

3 everyday cotton dresses.

1 petticoat, black silesia (4 yds. to each petticoat; should last two years).

2 petticoats, gingham (4 yds. to each petticoat).

(For very cold climates both of these items may be estimated for; in other climates 2 outing-flannel petticoats (3yds. to each skirt). one or the other.

2 aprons of gingham or denim.

2 aprons of white crossbar.

6 suits of underwear, selected according to climate.

4 pairs of shoes.

7 pairs of hose (the fleece-lined cotton are for cold climates).

3 nightdresses of unbleached muslin (2½ vds. of 6/4 muslin to each garment) or of outing flannel (4 vds. to each garment).

pair of arctics or rubbers.

coat or cape (should last three years).

1 shawl, single or double (should last three years). 2 hats.

2 shirtwaists of Indian head muslin (3 yds. to each waist), for nonreservation schools.

2 underwaists, outing flannel (2 vds. to each waist), for cold climates.

Necessary quantities of buttons, tape, ribbons, pins, etc.

Note.—It is suggested that sufficient muslin, white, 48 x 48, 36-inch, bleached shrunk finish, "Indian head" or equal, can be saved from the allowance to make graduation dresses, where a uniform dress is desirable.

Opposite various items listed on the following pages the maximum allowance for each pupil is given. These allowances must govern in preparing estimates. Where an allowance is not stated, superintendents should estimate according to their best judgment.

Opposite the cloth the maximum allowance for each pupil is given.

Knit underwear is furnished for summer and winter wear for both sexes. This should relieve, to a degree, the pressure on the sewing room, so that seamstresses may have more time for practical teaching.

Outing flannel has been substituted for Canton flannel for use in colder climates.

Mexican straw hats will be furnished for boys and girls for farm wear. This will be the only straw hat. The cloth tam-o'-shanter is for girls of all ages for summer and winter wear. The Canadian toque, or stocking cap, is for the smaller boys and girls in cold climates.

In localities where the Indian children are not accustomed to wear rubbers, and suffer no ill results thereby, it is not expected that rubbers will be furnished.

Police.

Each policeman may be allowed annually, as required, 1 coat, 1 waistcoat, and 2 pairs trousers, summer weight; 1 coat, 1 waistcoat, and 2 pairs trousers, winter weight; 2 hats (cap may be substituted for 1 hat); rations, and forage for horse or pony in accordance with the regular ration and forage tables in Regulations, Indian Office, 1904; and in addition thereto a cotton or woolen blanket, a saddle, bridle, saddle blanket, revolver, ammunition, belt, holster, and badge. The horse or pony must be furnished by the policeman.

Take a large tin or galvanized-iron dish, holding about 5 gallons (such as is used in the household for washing dishes), pour in the formaldehyde, then add the permanganate of potash, and leave the room AT ONCE. The room must be as tightly closed as possible. Allow the room to be exposed to formaldehyde gas about twelve hours.
