NEWS ITEM OF MOTY TIGER

Muskogee, Ok., Dec. 14

The insurgent Creek Indians are after the jobs held by Moty Tiger, the full-blood chief, and M. L. Mott, national attorney for the Creek Nation, drawing a salary of \$5,000 per year.

The insurgents are the progressive Indians, who want their tribal affairs closed up and their people treated as white citizens. That policy, according to their belief, is not being furthered by their chief. Furthermore, they say the chief is not accomplishing anything for his people, and that he is dominated by Mott, the Creek attorney. The insurgents want both offices abolished, their landed estates settled up and the tribal money paid over. To that end they will send a delegation to Washington this winter.
